

Become a Citizen Scientist for an Ovarian Cancer Outreach Study

CONNECTING FAMILIES TO OVERCOME OVARIAN CANCER is a research study funded by the National Cancer Institute and conducted at Emory University.

We are recruiting survivors and their close relatives to become ***citizen scientists*** and help us develop a website and print materials to expand access to genetic services for families affected by ovarian cancer.

As a citizen scientist, you will:

- Receive training on how to collect information from the community;
- Choose a data collection activity;
- Work in a team supported by a research coach;
- Collect and interpret interviews and surveys of survivors and close relatives;
- Commit about 20 hours over 12-weeks;
- Be compensated for your time.

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You are eligible if you:

- speak English;
- are 25 years or older;
- have access to and are comfortable using the internet.

As an ovarian cancer survivor, you also must:

- be at least one year post cancer treatment;
- be connected to a community of ovarian cancer survivors (either a personal or professional).

Relatives of ovarian cancer survivors:

- must be related by blood;
- the survivor family member must be at least one year post cancer treatment;
- must be connected to a community of relatives of ovarian cancer survivors (either personal or professional).
